The 2024 European elections loom as a moment of exceptional significance for the European Union and its citizens. The 2024-2029 mandate holds profound implications for the trajectory of the European project.

In the European Greens 2024 Manifesto: *Courage to Change*, at page 41, it is stated:

*“To face the great challenges of our century, from the green transition to fighting growing inequalities and protecting democracy, **the European Union needs to reform its treaties and move forward towards a federal Europe able to act and welcome new members.** At the Conference on the Future of Europe, European citizens gave a clear message that they support new treaties giving the EU greater competences. They called for deepened European democracy, with more power for the European Parliament, an end to national vetoes, a larger EU budget, and stronger EU competences on key issues such as health, tax, and social protection. As Greens, we stand behind their proposals”.*

The Manifesto: *Towards the United States of Europe*, proposed by the Union of European Federalists (UEF), the Spinelli Group in the European Parliament, the Young European Federalists (JEF) and the Jean Monnet Association is aligned with this vision. We call on the

pro-European political forces to develop a pan-European debate and champion Treaty revisions aimed at fortifying the Union's capacity to act effectively and protect its citizens' interests.

Hence, we ask that, subsequent to the elections for the European Parliament in June 2024, you request the European Council's support for the opening of the Treaty reform procedure (article 48 of the TFEU) on the basis of Parliament's Amendments to the Treaty Report of 22nd November 2023 as a precondition for endorsing its proposal for the President of the European Commission.

We also call for the presidential candidate's commitment to the said Treaty reform in order to get the full backing of your parliamentary group for his/her election and that of the entire College of Commissioners.
